- **12th**. May we honour the glory of God in creation. We pray for the care of the natural world.
- **13th**. We pray "Your kingdom come " Bring five people before the Lord in prayer.
- **14th** We pray rest and help for overwhelmed and exhausted medical staff I n India and other countries so badly affected by Covid 19.
- **15th**. For the proclamation of your word to those who have never heard that they may be gripped by the good news of Jesus Christ their Saviour.
- **16th**. We pray that animals rearing young and birds on the nest will find enough to eat.
- **17th.** Lord we pray that our prayers for more love and compassion in the world may begin with us.
- **18th.** During Covid 19 many have become more appreciative of creation. We pray this will continue.
- **19th**. We pray that our ecosystems and resources will be managed more sustainably.
- **20th**. We pray for all who have grown cold or are far away from you. By your Spirit draw them to yourself.
- **21st.** Enable us Lord to be part of making our longing for fairness a reality as we follow you more nearly.
- **22nd.** We pray for those who are left out or feel like outsiders. May our arms be open to embrace all as you do.
- **23rd.** On this Pentecost Sunday pour out your Holy Spirit upon your Church worldwide that we may be filled and renewed in the power of your Spirit.

- **24th.** Father we continue to ask for an end to the pandemic and fairer worldwide distribution of vaccines and medicines.
- **25th.** Gardens and woodlands enrich the environment. We pray that we may all cherish what You have made and given us to enjoy.
- **26th.** Lord help us bring our wounds and hurts to you for healing.
- **27th.** Help us forgive for we will never have to forgive more than you have forgiven. We thank you and praise you for all we have in Jesus.
