"Even though we cannot be together in person, we can be together in spirit. We can share in the same worship, pray together using the same words, be inspired together by the same Bible verses and affirm our unity as the body of Christ here on earth.

"Ordinarily, the worship of the Church is offered locally, rightly so. But it seems to me that in these present circumstances there is merit in giving over one Sunday to come together."

"Church at Home" will be back next week as normal - but for this week - please join with me in sharing our worship to God with with the whole of the national church.

Scottish churches issue joint call for Sunday prayer on 31st May

Once more, churches across Scotland have come together to encourage Christians to join together in prayer at 7pm on Sunday evening in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Join with fellow Christians across Scotland in Sunday prayer at 7pm in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.



This week, 14 Christian churches and organisations across the country, including the Church of Scotland, have co-signed the letter calling for prayer.

Since the start of lockdown, Christians from across the country have been continuing to answer the call to pray at the same time each week, and Rt Rev Dr Martin Fair, Moderator of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, is looking forward to taking part alongside them this weekend.

"I'm delighted to have read that in the last couple of months online searches for 'prayer' have increased dramatically," Dr Fair said.

"But reading about what prayer is and how to do it is the only the start of it. After that it's time to actually pray.

"And what better than to join with brothers and sisters from across the nation at 7pm on Sunday to pray our way through this ongoing crisis. I commend it to you and look forward to being with you, in Spirit, on Sunday evening."

This week's letter accompanying the prayer, which will also be available in Gaelic (a copy of which will be attached here later today), states:

"Though we are moving into the first stages of the easing of lockdown, we continue to be painfully aware that there's a long way to go and that what lies at the end of it all remains unclear.

"And so we proceed in faith, believing that God always goes before us and knows the end from the beginning.

"On this Day of Pentecost we give thanks for the gift of the Holy Spirit, believing that it is by the Spirit that God guides us."

We pray:

Almighty God, by your Spirit, you brought order from chaos. By your brooding Spirit, hovering over the void, you spoke and there was ... something rather than nothing.

Create and recreate in and through us, we pray.

Almighty God, by your Spirit, you equipped and gifted and led our ancestors to know you and to serve you and to glorify you. Continue to equip and enable us, we pray.

And then, Almighty God, as promised by the prophets and as never before, you poured out your Spirit on these first believers - on men and women, on the old and the young; and they were transformed and made alive, as dry bones brought to life.

Pour out your Spirit on us, we pray.

Almighty God, in these turbulent and uncertain times, send us the Comforter, that we might know you to be near. Grant us your healing touch and help us to know the rest that comes from resting in you. For the loving touch of your Spirit, we pray.

Almighty God, by what seemed as a rushing wind and as tongues of fire you brought your Church to life.

Come to your Church now, we pray, that by the same Spirit we might be renewed and refreshed and remade and revived.

Yes, Lord, grant us a fresh outpouring of your Spirit, we pray.

And all our prayers we offer in the name of our Lord and Saviour, none other than Jesus Christ.

Amen.

Moderator urges churches to support Thy Kingdom Come

The Moderator is encouraging everyone to join him in taking part in the Thy Kingdom Come global prayer movement.

Rt Rev Dr Martin Fair has backed the Scottish Church Leaders Forum in calling all Christians to join the ecumenical season of prayer, which will run from Ascension Day, 21 May to Pentecost Sunday.



The Scottish church leaders have released a statement saying:

"On behalf of the undersigned churches in Scotland, we welcome the opportunity to participate in the Global Prayer Initiative: Thy Kingdom Come 2020.

"Now in its fifth year, the movement draws thousands of Christians together, across different denominations and traditions, to pray for their friends, family and neighbours to come to know the love of Jesus.

"In the face of the Covid 19 pandemic, Thy Kingdom Come resources have been adapted to enable churches, families and individuals to pray and worship in their homes, through a collection of resources, in line with social distancing guidelines.

"For the first time this year, Christians are not only encouraged to pray for others to know the love of Christ, but to also practically demonstrate their love and care through action during the 11 days, through an initiative called Prayer and Care.

"All key resources are available as digital downloads on the Thy Kingdom Come website and offer practical ways in which family and church can be involved.

"At this time especially, we commend this initiative to you and invite you to participate and pray: 'Thy Kingdom come'."

In May Suresh Vemulapalli from India Village Ministries was due to visit with us at Fetteresso. IVM along with our food bank here in Stonehaven are the subject of our Monthly Prayer Focus.

IVM team are very busily engaged helping the people on a daily basis with their food requirements – that's really looking after, caring for, showing

compassion, and truly loving all 'our brothers and sisters - who are all our neighbours' in accordance with the Lord's two great commandments.

We are distributing essential food pack (5Kgs of rice, 1 kg Lentil and 1 kg sunflower oil, vegetables/eggs) to many starving families in our region. This food pack costs ONLY £6 (\$9).

Prayer requests from Suresh, India Village Ministries:

Most people including daily wage workers have moved from the cities to be with their families in rural areas for the duration of the lockdown. Due to lock down, people in the villages are not working. This has created huge psychological and financial stresses. The price of things has increased significantly. Some poor families in the slums are literally starving for food.

Relief aid from IVM has been delivered to slums dwellers, migrant daily workers, poor people who are starving for food. Hundreds of families have been given rice bags, 30 eggs for each family, onions in Challapalli mandal, Krishna District of Andhra Pradesh.

There is a fear that the number of confirmed cases will increase and, if this happens, our

country's health services are not in a position to handle it.

- We need God's intervention in this situation to stop the spread of this deadly virus.
- Give thanks that Regional sub-Inspector of Police and Mandal revenue Officers, Village Administrative Officer participated in this distribution program. The Officers commended services of IVM in this crisis situation. Local media personnel also helped IVM to distribute this aid to needy people.
- Pray for the protection of us, the children in our orphanage, elderly widows, pastors and all our staff as we minister to families, that the Lord will provide for the needs of those under our care.
- Many poor people in rural India live day to day but without work, they starve.

Pray for us at this time as the needs are great.

We believe that God is sovereign and in control in the midst of these stressful days. He will continue to be a shield and provider for His people. The most important thing is

One of the Key themes for Thy Kingdom Come 2020 is prayer and care. As we are praying for those we love to come to know the hope and love of Christ, we also are encouraging all to see how they can show God's love towards them by caring for them. The website suggests practical ways to show Prayer and Care.

Alongside this, there is a very helpful resource "Thy Kingdom Come - five ways to get involved" which is easily adapted for congregations in lockdown. It also includes many other resources which can be downloaded to use at home.

Whether you use the Family Prayer Adventure Map or the 11 day Prayer Journal, the same creativity congregations have employed to set up online worship and find new ways for undertaking pastoral care can equally be employed to stimulate united prayer. You can pray together at set times or set up a continuous virtual prayer event. There is a wealth of practical accessible ideas for all.
