

Dear friends, brothers and sisters.

As we step into March together, we do so with a clear and prayerful focus: **the power and work of the Holy Spirit**. Throughout Scripture, we see that whenever God prepares His people for renewal, mission, or deeper intimacy with Him, He draws them back to dependence on His Spirit. From the promise of power in Acts to the teaching of Jesus throughout the gospels, the message is clear: the Church does not move forward by strength or strategy alone, but by the Spirit of God.

This month then, our prayer is simple but profound: **“Come, Holy Spirit.”**

To declare this with our mouths and our hearts is not a routine phrase or a religious formality. It is an act of surrender. It is an admission that we cannot transform ourselves, heal our own hearts, or fulfil God’s purposes in our own strength.

When we say, “Come, Holy Spirit,” we are inviting His power to convict, to comfort, to renew, to empower, and to guide. We are asking Him to awaken spiritual gifts, to deepen love for Christ, and to bind us together as one body.

For each individual member of this congregation, this prayer means openness. It means creating space in our daily lives for the Spirit to search us, shape us, and send us. It means expecting Him to work not only in extraordinary moments, but in ordinary obedience: at home, at work, in conversations, and in quiet faithfulness.

Over the next four weeks of devotions, we will be looking closely at the work of the Holy Spirit: who He is, what He does, and how He moves among God’s people.

Together, we will consider not only the Spirit’s work in history, but His ongoing work in us today. As we reflect on Scripture and pray intentionally, we will ask: What would it look like for our congregation to truly live by the Spirit? What might God do if we were fully yielded to His power?

May this month be marked by hunger, expectancy, and bold faith. And as one body, may we continually declare: **Come, Holy Spirit.**

Week 1

Reading focus: **Acts 1:8**

If Jesus promises that we will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes, are you living with the expectation of that power at work in your life, and where might God be inviting you to depend on it more fully?

Week 2

Reading focus: **Galatians 5:16-25**

If the Spirit is already at work within you, what evidence of His fruit is growing in your life, and where might He be prompting you to surrender more fully so He can continue His transforming work?

Week 3

Reading focus: **Ezekiel 36:26-27**

God promises to put His Spirit within His people and move them to follow His ways, where do you need the Spirit to soften your heart and lead you into deeper obedience?

Week 4

Reading focus: **Romans 8:11**

If the same Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead lives in you, how might that resurrection power change the way you face weakness, fear, or challenge this week?
